General Information

Item	Description			
Course Length	The course runs over 8 weeks plus a 2-week period of assessment feedback and review.			
Course Description	Swallowing anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology, focuses on the key structures, processes and disorders involved in human swallowing.			
	This course includes modules on structural and muscular anatomy, peripheral and central neuroanatomy, and differentiating biomechanics from underlying pathology.			
Learning Outcomes	Learning Outcome 1: Distinguish the anatomical, physiological and developmental mechanisms that underlay normal and disordered deglutition.			
	Learning Outcome 2: Categorise major structures of the upper aerodigestive tract and evaluate their purpose for swallowing-related functions.			
	Learning Outcome 3: Identify the role of nervous system structures for sensorimotor control of swallowing processes.			
Learning Impact	The course will equip learners with a strong foundation in normal swallowing function, which will enable them to recognise deviations from normal function in patients with swallowing disorders.			
Delivery	All UC (University of Canterbury) Online courses are fully online. You can learn anywhere, any time, and you won't need to visit a campus.			
	This course is instructor paced which means you will need to work through the course materials and assignments in the relevant weeks as outlined below. Therefore, you will need to complete assignments each week, you can work at your own pace but there are specific submission dates each week.			
Estimated hours per week	We estimate your engagement will be about 6 - 7 hours a week over 8 weeks.			
Qualification	Microcredential: This is a standalone course that recognises the achievement of specific skills, experience, or knowledge.			
	If you successfully complete this course, your results may be recorded on an academic transcript and be recognised through a digital badge you can add to your LinkedIn profile or online CV.			
Academic points	Each course has a points value that reflects the workload for the course. Successful completion from this course will result in you being awarded 6 points at NZQF Level 8.			



Recommended prior learning	There are no prerequisites for this course, but a basic understanding of anatomy and physiology will help you understand the more technical terminology. This course is for anyone interested in learning more about the anatomy and physiology of swallowing.			
Who is this course for?	 This course is ideal for: Health professionals, especially those who have interest in swallowing disorders (e.g., speech-language therapists) People with a professional interest in learning more about the anatomy of swallowing. 			
Technology Requirements	 We recommend a laptop or desktop computer and a reliable internet connection. Word processing software (like Microsoft Word or Google Docs) to complete your assignments. 			
How the course works	 You'll need to work through this course sequentially. It's divided into 7 modules that run over eight weeks. Use the navigation block on the left of screen to move from one module to another. Each module includes the following material: Specific learning objectives and module introduction. Topic content using a range of media. Activities to apply what you've learnt and/or discuss with your peers and facilitator. Q&A Sessions (live) with the course instructors. A 'temperature check' survey to seek your feedback about your experience as a learner. You will have access to each module's content at the start of the course, but you won't be able to submit your assignment if you haven't gone through the course content in each module. 			
Assessment	To receive a passing grade for this course, you need to have attempted all activities and to have received an overall grade of at least 50%. For more details see the assessment schedule below.
